FROM THE FOUNDER

Friends,

Amped Kids Foundation celebrated its 5th anniversary of serving foster and adopted youth in 2023, expanding our reach to include at-risk youth affected by trauma or at risk of entering care. We fostered new collaborations with The Salvation Army, providing music programs for 30 youth, including a new music room at the Gainesville Salvation Army location.

Together, we have made a positive impact on many lives, with 63 music students enrolled in 2023, receiving a total of 497 music lessons and benefiting from 197 provided musical instruments.

With great enthusiasm and a dedicated team, we launched a new Nashville Chapter. Thanks to our collaboration with Free Guitars 4 Kids, Gibson Guitars provided 13 guitars. We awarded one band scholarship, and welcomed 9 new students into our music lesson program. It was an excellent beginning for this new chapter.

I often speak of the power of planting a seed – a tiny seed that can grow into a majestic tree. Similarly, every investment in a child plants seeds for the future. With the support of our partners and collaborators, we have planted and nurtured these seeds, and we are now witnessing their growth. Thank you for embracing our vision and investing in the children we serve.

OUR PURPOSE

Amped Kids Foundation's vision is to assist foster and adopted youth in healing from traumatic experiences by offering music programs. These programs are scientifically proven to reduce stress, anxiety, depression, and to rewire neural pathways in the brain, thereby creating avenues for enhanced mental health and wellness. Music also fosters a safe space for connection, and as we welcome youth into our "One Big Music Family," they discover lifelong support and mentorship that provides the consistency needed for those who have endured trauma.



In 2023, our One Big Music Family truly came through, providing new connections, forging new collaborations, and securing additional funding that enabled us to serve on a larger scale.

Our partnership with Amerigroup has broadened our outreach, enabling us to serve more youth and raise awareness of our programs across their network. Matthew started his journey with Amped Kids with a recording studio tour at the private home studio of John Driskell Hopkins from the Zac Brown Band in 2019 and subsequently started guitar lessons. He was a diligent student, but he took a break from lessons in 2020. Nevertheless, Matthew continued to play the guitar and, upon attending a songwriting workshop two years later, had developed into a highly skilled guitarist.

Matthew resumed guitar lessons and connected with Let There Be Rock, as he has been drawn to a rock style of music. At an Amped Kids event last year, Matthew's brother revealed that Matthew rises at 5:30 am each day before school to practice his guitar.

Matthew's journey has been challenging, marked by struggles with the effects of trauma. However, he has shown significant improvements in self-confidence and social development. Music has been therapeutic for Matthew, empowering him as a means of self-expression.
